- 4. Does everyone on our team have clarity around our spiritual formation pathway? When we meet for annual planning, do we plan with this pathway in mind (holistically) or do we tend to plan by ministry (individually)?
- 5. In what ways do we empower and encourage our pastoral and leadership team? Is there anything we could do differently that would further rally them to lead boldly?

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
