How to Not Hate Preaching About Money Episode 392

Self-Assessment: How Are We Doing?

- 1. Reviewing our sermons over the past year, how often have we normalized talking about money and generosity in church by actually preaching on it?
- 2. Now, looking forward, when in the next year do we plan to preach on these topics? As we plan these sermons, let's consider these three areas that can increase the impact of these messages:
 - a. How can we bring authenticity to our messages on money? What personal stories can we share?
 - b. What is the giving culture in our church, and what do our people need to hear (e.g., ownership, practical help, etc.)?
 - c. How can we support our church in giving (e.g., finance/budget classes, books, etc.)?

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
